LYMM.

LYMM (formerly written LIMME), is a parish in Altrincham union, the centre of the polling district to which it gives its name, containing, by the census of 1861, 3769, and in 1871, 4541 inhabitants, and 4284 acres; in the hundred of Bucklow, east division of Frodsham deanery, archdeaconry, and diocese of Chester, Mid Cheshire; 5 miles south-west from Warrington, 6 west from Altrincham, 7 north-west from Knutsford, and 13½ from Manchester, on the Warrington and Stockport Railway, which has two

stations here; and on the Bridgewater Canal, which intersects the parish. The rectory was divided into two medietyes previously to the Norman conquest, the first mediety valued at £336 per annum, with residence, is in the incumbency of the Rev. Thomas Redhead Branfoot, M.A., and the patronage of Egerton Leigh, Esq. The church is a handsome edifice, in the early decorated style, dedicated to the Virgin Mary, consisting of nave, chancel, north and south aisles, transept, and tower, and was erected in 1850-1, on the site of a former one. The Baptists, Congregationalists, Primitive and Wesleyan Methodists each have places of worship here.

THE GRAMMAR SCHOOL, which was originally endowed in 1608, by Sir George Warburton and William Donville, was re-opened in August, 1864. There are parochial schools in Pepper Street, which were erected some years ago with funds left for that purpose by Lieut.-Colonel Thomas Jackson. The staple trade of this town is fustian cutting, which gives employment to several hundreds. The town is under the management of a Local Board.

OUGHTRINGTON is a hamlet of this parish, which will form the centre of a separate ecclesiastical district or parish, to which the second mediety of the rectory will be appropriated. A new church has been erected at the expense of G. C. Dewhurst, Esq., J.P., which was consecrated on the 29th June, 1872. It is a handsome stone edifice, standing on an eminence, and consisting of nave, chancel, north and south aisles, and tower, surmounted by a spire; the pulpit is of marble, richly carved and fixed on a stone pedestal; the font is also of marble.

HEATLEY is a hamlet of this parish, about 1½ mile north-east, in which one of the railway stations is situate.

BROOMEDGE, 1½ mile east, RUSH GREEN, 1 mile north-east, and STATHAM, 1 mile north-west, are also hamlets of this parish.

Egerton Leigh and Rowland Byles Egerton Warburton, Esqs., are lords of the manor.
